- NRCS offers technical and financial assistance for voluntary conservation
  - Technical assistance is provided through an on-site assessment with the landowner to determine goals and objectives, and it could include:
    - Develop pollinator habitat
    - Improve forest health
    - Controlling soil erosion
  - Financial assistance is provided through Farm Bill Programs, and could include:
    - The Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP)
    - The Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)

  - NRCS develops a conservation plan based on what you decide to do








To help the rusty patched bumblebee and other pollinators such as butterflies and moths.

grow flowers, including flowering trees and shrubs - but make sure they do not contain neonicolinoid pesticides. Have a mix with something in bloom from early spring

through fall, include native milkwoods for monarch

Bumblebees and many other polinators need a safe place to build their nests and overwinter. Leave some areas of your yard up-mowed in summer and unraced in falt in your garden and flower beds, leave some standing

The bee emerges in early spring and is one of the last bumblebee species to go into hibernation in the fall. Because It is active so long, it needs a constant supply of flowers blooming from April through Sep-

The federal government in September listed seven species of Hawaiian yellow-faced bees as endangered. They were the first bees in the United States listed under the ESA but Hawaii, and they are not





#### High Tunnel

- Sometimes called a hoop house
- Enclosed polyethylene, polycarbonate, plastic, or fabric covered structure
- Used to cover and protect crops from sun, wind excessive rainfall, or cold, to extend the growing season in an environmentally safe manner
- Crops are grown in the natural soil profile not in containers or hydroponics
- Single layer of cover vs double layer used in a greenhouse



#### High Tunnel – Gothic Style

#### **GOTHIC**

- Better Solar Gain, more heat
- Sheds snow load better
- Straight Sidewalls give more workable space
- Better ventilation
- No drip line



### High Tunnel - Round Style



#### **ROUND/QUANSET**

- Geometrically strong shape
- Often less expensive
- Easier to build without a kit

#### Benefits of a high tunnel

- Extend growing season
  - Extra 3-4 weeks on each end of growing season
- Controlled environment
  - Protection from heavy rain and wind

- Apply for financial assistance to implement a practice or practices in your conservation plan
- Work with the Farm Service Agency (FSA) to ensure you have a Farm and Tract Number
- Eligibility forms
  - Compliance Highly Erodible Land and Wetland Conservation
  - Adjusted Gross Income
- Application form CPA-1200
- Applications are accepted on a continuous basis

- Producer eligibility-Applicant must:
  - Establish USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Records
    - Farm and Tract number
  - Provide tax identification number that will be associated with the application and contract.
  - Be an agricultural producer
    - Person
    - Legal entity
    - ■Indian Tribe
    - Joint Operation

# 3 Eligibility

- Have control of the land for the term of the proposed contract period
- Be within payment limitation requirements
  - ► Each contract is limited to no more than \$450,000
- Be in compliance with
  - Highly erodible land and wetland conservation compliance provisions
  - Adjustable Gross Income (AGI) requirements



#### Land Eligibility Requirements

- Be agricultural land, nonindustrial private forest land, Tribal land or other on land which agricultural products, livestock, or forest-related products are produced
- Participant provides written permission from the landowner to allow implementation of structural or vegetative practices, if necessary
- Planned practices will address an identified natural resource concern



- NRCS will rank applications according to:
  - According to local resource concerns
  - Amount of conservation benefits

Highest ranking applications are selected for funding.

# 5 Implementing

- If you're selected, you can choose whether to sign the contract.
- The contract contains a Schedule of Operations, which designates the practice installation timeline.
- Install practices according to NRCS standards and specifications.
- Once the work is implemented and inspected complete a payment request to receive financial assistance.
